Dr. Anand Nene originally trained as an orthopaedic surgeon in Mumbai, India and in the United Kingdom. He worked as a Medical Research Fellow in the Orthotic Research & Locomotor Assessment Unit (ORLAU) at the Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital in Oswestry. He worked on orthotic locomotion for persons with spinal cord injury (SCI). There he also developed his interest in use of Gait Analysis for clinical decision making in Cerebral Palsy.
