

Dr. Eric MAUPAS, MD, PhD

Eric Maupas, MD, PhD, is a physical medicine and rehabilitation specialist. He was born on March 20, 1966.

He studied medicine at the University of Bordeaux, France and completed his Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation residency program at the Institut Régional de Réadaptation and University Hospital of Nancy, France. He was assistant professor at the University Hospital of Toulouse, France from 1998 to 2001. Then he was the head of the rehabilitation centre

of Albi, France from 2001 to 2015. He is presently the head doctor of the inpatient pediatric rehabilitation unit, Centre Paul Dottin, ASEI, in Ramonville Saint-Agne – Toulouse, France.

His research topics mainly concern the motor control of the lower limb, with a particular emphasis on the implication of intersegmental spinal pathways in the motor deficits following a stroke. He completed a PhD at the University of Dijon, Bourgogne, France in 2003 and he worked as a post-doctoral fellow from 2004 to 2005 in the neurophysiology laboratory of the Centre de Recherche Interdisciplinaire en Réadaptation (CRIR), Institut de Réadaptation Gingras-Lindsay, Montréal, Québec, Canada.

Dr Eric Maupas has been using botulinum toxin in the treatment of spasticity for 20 years both in children and adults.
